A best practice is to have all of these items tabbed out or identified to be able to demonstrate eligibility for the practical test to the examiner. They will be required to determine and confirm eligibility prior to beginning the test. The faster they are able to do that and the easier you make it, the sooner the test will be able to begin. If they are unable to determine eligibility or are missing documentation, they may be unable to begin the test and it may need to be rescheduled.
